### SUMMARY OF RESULTS

House Leaders	Directors of Students	Senior Student leaders
<p>House leaders recommend that the current grooming expectations as outlined in the diary should be maintained.</p> <p>They emphasised the difficulty in implementing the policy when certain styles are tolerated.</p> <p>They expressed that the requirement of consistent hair length for boys is less important than having a neat and well-presented hairstyle.</p> <p>House leaders emphasised that extreme length differences should not be tolerated.</p> <p>House Leaders are not in favour of boys tying their hair back or up as this expectation is difficult to implement with consistency.</p>	<p>Concerned with the disparity between the college expectations and the level of students' compliance;</p> <p>A strong appreciation for the relationships between high standards of grooming and effective behaviour management of students;</p> <p>Recommend that the current expectations are relevant and suggest the following adjustments:</p> <p><i>Hair – boys</i></p> <p><i>Hair should be of a consistent length all over, that is, no undercuts or frullets, or shaved on one side.</i></p> <p><i>Hair should not be worn longer than the top of the collar. It may be neatly tied back.</i></p>	<p>Due to changing trends in society, we thought that it would be a good idea if the NCC hair regulations could be changed slightly to better suit the individuals within the school whilst still maintaining a neat and presentable appearance.</p> <p>Hair should always be clean, neat and tidy by being kept out of the face and eyes.</p> <p>If hair is longer than the collar, students should be given the option to tie it up, or cut it off. (This has been heard of as being a rule in Catholic schools in Perth)</p> <p>Uneven lengths/undercuts should be allowed.</p> <p>The 'man bun' should be allowed as long as it is pulled back neatly (as per girl hair regulations)</p> <p>No mullets.</p>
