


What is CSL?

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

You are required to complete a variety of service activities, in your own time.

You can choose the type of activity in response to what you have identified as a need within your home, family or neighbourhood community. There is no need to look outside the group of people you know and feel comfortable with.

The service you provide must be done freely without expectation of reward, money or gifts.

It is important that you give this service with a willing heart and a desire to make a positive impact on someone's life.

The activities you choose should be above and beyond what you may already do through routine chores.

To complete the program you must;

- Participate in **THREE** different types of service activities e.g.: mowing lawns, weeding gardens, babysitting;
- Complete a minimum of **EIGHT** hours of voluntary service;
- Record all service activity details and reflections on your Service Record;
- Ensure each record of service has been verified by an adult signature;
- Hand in your Service Record by the due date in **TERM THREE**



MY RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES AS A VOLUNTARY WORKER

When working as a volunteer you have -

The **right** to:

- choose the type of service you provide;
- choose to complete your service activities in an environment which feels comfortable and safe;
- ask for appropriate instructions and receive the tools to perform the task safely;
- receive feedback about your progress.



The **responsibility** to:

- act justly;
- be dependable;
- be willing to be shown how to properly complete an activity;
- perform the task to the best of your ability;
- accept advice or feedback regarding the completed activity;
- have your service work verified by an adult supervisor, parent or guardian;
- hand in your completed Service Record by the due date.
