Purpose

Nagle Catholic College is committed to ensuring a respectful learning environment that is safe, positive and supportive for all students of the College.

Our Code of Conduct is a set of guidelines for behaviour which seeks to establish at Nagle Catholic College a harmonious environment in which students are able to grow and flourish, and which is conducive to the pursuit of excellence in all fields. As would be expected in a College whose motto is 'For Others', consideration for members of the community is a prominent feature of our guiding principles.

All members of the Nagle Catholic College Community will show their pride in belonging to this unique community by the generous manner in which they observe this Code, and by the manner in which they wear the uniform, the public sign of their membership of the community. Students are expected to adhere to this Code of Conduct at all times, including when travelling to and from the College, and whenever they are representing the College or under its duty of care, regardless of whether they are in College uniform.

Conduct

Students are expected to:

- Be respectful and supportive of the College's beliefs, values and ethos
- Refrain from behaviour which would damage the reputation of the College
- Respect the authority of staff members and observe College rules

Behaviour in the Classroom

- Students are to be on time and prepared for every class (pencil case with correct equipment, books and device)
- Students are to enter class appropriately
- Students and teachers are to greet each other – Students are to use the teacher's title and name (e.g. Good morning Mr Smith)
- Students are to take their hats off when they enter class
- Students are not to open devices until instructed to do so by their teacher
- Students are only permitted to leave class with the permission of their teacher
- The teacher must be allowed to teach, and fellow students must be able to concentrate and learn
- Ideas are to be expressed appropriately, and the ideas of others are to be respected
- Students are to take pride in their work and presentation
- Classrooms are to be treated with pride, and kept clean and tidy
- Food is not to be consumed in class and chewing gum is not permitted on school grounds



- Water may be consumed in class but not in close proximity to technology equipment or in the Edmund Rice Learning Centre
- Students are not able to leave the classroom for a drink during the first 10 minutes of class
- Students are to be responsible for filling up their water bottles during break times and not during class
- Respect is to be shown for College property
- Students are not to bring backpacks to class
- At the end of class, students are to wait to be dismissed by their teacher and then leave in an orderly manner
- If students are absent from classes for any reason, they are expected to access set work via SEQTA

Moving around the College

- Students are to use pathways and keep to the left, giving adults priority at all times
- Students are to move quickly and directly to each class

During Breaks in the Day

- Students are to use appropriate areas for activities (e.g. oval for running, courts for ball games etc.)
- Students are to refrain from inappropriate body contact
- Rough play is not permitted because of physical danger and damage to clothing – If this occurs and damage is caused, in addition to consequences issued by the Director of Students, the student who caused the damage will be required to replace the item
- Students are not to congregate in pathways
- Students are to be aware of the safety of others
- Students are expected to follow the direction of staff at all times
- The environment should be respected (e.g. grassed areas, gardens and trees) and there is to be no climbing or jumping off or over walls
- Respect to others and their groups and games is to be shown at all times
- Devices are not to be used during break times – These times are for socialising and eating
- Students are to respond to the bell quickly from break times
- Litter is to be placed in a bin
- Students are required to wear the College hat during break times and when involved in outdoor classes

Leaving the College Grounds

- Students are not permitted to communicate with anyone at the school fence during school hours
- If a student needs to leave the grounds to collect sports equipment, permission from the duty teacher must be sought
- Students must receive permission from a parent/guardian and sign “out” when leaving the school grounds and sign “in” when returning
- Visitors to the College are required to sign in at Reception to identify themselves and collect a ‘visitor’s badge’ – They are to state their business at the start of their visit

Relationships with Others

- Any physical contact of an intimate nature is not permitted, as it is totally inappropriate at school or at school functions
- Any kind of bullying, harassment, violence or denigration, verbal or physical or via social media, is strictly forbidden
- Swearing and inappropriate language is not permitted



Lockers

- Students can be in locker areas before and after school to drop off or collect their items
- Students can be in locker areas during the first five minutes of break times to access their food/drink
- No student should be in a locker area during a class time unless items are being collected
 - Items for Periods 1, 2 and 3 are to be collected from lockers before Home Room
 - Items for Periods 4 and 5 are to be collected from lockers during Break 1
 - Items for Period 6 are to be collected from lockers during Break 2
- Students are not permitted to return to their lockers during class time (with the exception of students returning from Physical Education classes to collect devices)
- Food is not to be eaten in locker areas
- There is to be no loitering in locker areas
- Students are not allowed in lockers that are not their own
- Students are not to access or tamper with others students' lockers
- Lockers are to be kept locked at all times with a College padlock, so that valuables are kept secure

Email, Internet, SEQTA and Network Use

- Students are responsible for their actions when using ICT
- Students will accept personal responsibility for reporting any misuse or abuse of the College network to their teacher. Misuse and abuse can come in many forms but includes any content accessed, sent or received related to cyber-bullying, pornography, unethical or illegal solicitation, racism, sexism or inappropriate language. Students need to be aware that inappropriate use may also break State and/or Federal laws
- Students must not access chat lines or forums that have not been sanctioned by the College
- Students must not use their CEWA email address in conjunction with any social media accounts

Use of Personal Electronic Devices

- The use of personal electronic devices is not permitted at the College between the hours of 8.30am and 3.05pm. If a student is found to be on their mobile phone/watch/device during this time, the mobile phone/watch/device will be collected by a member of the teaching staff and securely stored at the Presentation Centre (PC) for collection at the end of the day

Use of Earphones

- Earphones are able to be used in class as part of the education program, when directed by the teacher (e.g. watching Clickview, using texts with audio)
- Earphones are not to be used solely to listen to music as an accompaniment, while working on other tasks in class

Drugs, Weapons and other Dangerous Devices

- The consumption of energy drinks that contain large amounts of caffeine (e.g. Mother, Redbull, etc) are prohibited on College grounds
- The presence of illicit or illegal drugs or alcohol on the College premises is absolutely prohibited
- The taking or provision to another of illicit or illegal drugs or alcohol either on the College premises or off the College premises is absolutely prohibited
- The carrying or use of weapons or dangerous devices including flares, lasers and cigarette lighters is strictly forbidden



Pre-Apprenticeship in Schools (PAiS) and Workplace Learning (WPL)

The following College events are compulsory for PAiS and WPL students:

- Founders' Day Mass
- St Pat's Day Games
- Retreat
- Interhouse Swimming Carnival
- Interhouse Cross Country
- Interhouse Athletics Carnival

Supporting Positive Behaviour

To encourage students to adhere to the Code of Conduct the following incentives are utilised:

- Certificates of Commendation ('Goldies') for academic/pastoral achievements
- Recognition within House (eg at House Meetings)
- Recognition within Year Group (eg at Year Group Meetings)
- Recognition in front of the whole school (eg at Assemblies)
- Positive affirmations on SEQTA
- Reporting on SEQTA
- The Daily Notices
- The College Newsletter
- The College Facebook page
- The College website

For Academic Concern

Where there is an academic concern:

- Parents/Guardians will have the opportunity to discuss progress at Parent/Teacher/Student Interviews
- Marks/grades are visible on SEQTA

For Pastoral Care

The Pastoral Care Team at the College use a student management framework when dealing with student behaviour. This is a levels based framework that provides a guide when putting sanctions in place for negative behaviour.

- Level 1 – Low level behaviours (e.g. calling out in class) (Visible on SEQTA Engage)
- Level 2 – Medium level behaviours (e.g. repeated poor behaviour in class) (Visible on SEQTA Engage)
- Level 3 – Escalated behaviours (e.g. aggression towards others) (Not visible on SEQTA Engage)
- Level 4 – Major incidents (e.g. truancy) (Not visible on SEQTA Engage)
- Level 5 – Severe incidents (e.g. inappropriate social media comments) (Not visible on SEQTA Engage)
- Level 6 – Critical incidents (e.g. drug use at the College) (Not visible on SEQTA Engage)

Some of the sanctions for these levels of behaviour may include, but are not exclusive to:

- Level 1 – Classroom management strategies put in place e.g. seating plan
- Level 2 – Moved to a buddy class – Communication to parents/guardian
- Level 3 – Withdrawal from class or after school detention (On Wednesdays from 3.10-4.10pm – This can only be issued by a Director of Students)
- Level 4/5 – In school suspension
- Level 6 – External suspension



In accordance with applicable legislation and the College's Code of Conduct, the Police and/or Department for Child Protection and Family Support, will be informed of any unlawful breaches of this Code, where required and/or deemed appropriate.
